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Doc Day 2017 Impact and Solutions with Documentary Films Tuesday May 23rd, Cannes

The Doc Day organized by the Marché du Film with the support of JustFilms – Ford Foundation and the CNC (Centre National du Cinéma et de l'Image Animée), in association with L'Œil d'Or-Documentary Award, comes back to Cannes for its second edition.

This full day event will take place on **Tuesday May 23rd**. Conferences and discussions will gather documentary film professionals and non-fiction lovers under one crucial theme: **Impact and solutions with documentary films** – and how the documentary genre, in all its forms, can strive to bring a sense of awareness, togetherness and hopefully peace in our disrupted societies.

The Doc Day will be structured around three highlights unfolding as follows:

• The morning session will be introduced by the CNC (Centre National du Cinéma et de l'Image Animée) at the Plage du Gray d'Albion.

The day will start with an inspiring conversation between filmmaker **Amos Gitaï** and film critic **Jean-Michel Frodon** about his latest documentary *West of the Jordan River (Field Diary Revisited)* selected at the Quinzaine des Réalisateurs, a follow-up to his 1982 West Bank film *Field Diary*.

Then, the round-table "Documentaries in the Post-Truth Era" will bring together Kathleen Lingo, of the New York Times' pioneering Op-Docs platform; investigative correspondent Laurent Richard from Premières Lignes Télévision & current Knight-Wallace Fellow; Carrie Lozano, the director of IDA Enterprise Documentary Fund and Kathy Im the Director of the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation's Journalism and Media Program, who have recently joined forces to support nonfiction filmmakers taking on in-depth exploration of contemporary stories through a journalistic and documentary lens; Gonzalo Lamela, the director of Films For Transparency will add to the discussion with a point-of-view about fighting corruption and advocating for a more equitable world, through film. The discussion will be moderated by journalist Wendy Mitchell from our Media partner Screen International.

Quote of Julie Bergeron, Head of Industry Programs at the Marché du Film-Festival de Cannes: "In a world evolving from a society of facts to one of the big data, with fake news and populism invading the spheres of social networks, politics and press, documentary filmmakers are an essential voice to bring independent analysis through storytelling that helps to inform, engage and inspire us all to think critically and deeply about the challenges facing democracy in this Post-Truth Era."



• In the afternoon, the Doc Day will continue at the Olympia theatre with the support of the JustFilms-Ford Foundation.

Anne Georget the President of Scam and Laurent Vallet the Chairman & CEO of INA, will start by presenting L'Œil d'Or-Documentary Award, an award created in 2015 which will be awarded by a Jury presided by Sandrine Bonnaire to a documentary film presented in one of the Cannes' selections (Official Selection, Un Certain Regard, Cannes Classics, Special Screenings and Out of Competition, Short Films, Quinzaine des Réalisateurs and Critic's Week).

Cara Mertes the Director of JustFilms-Ford Foundation, will introduce the afternoon and converse with filmmaker **Jude Ratnam** about *Demons in Paradise* presented in Special Screening, Official Selection at the Festival de Cannes to tell us more about his personal story: the one of a five years old Sri Lankan Tamil boy who escaped an ethnic massacre by fleeing on a train and who is, 30 years later, a filmmaker in Cannes.

It will be followed by strong "Women Voices from the Arab World" featuring Kaouther Ben Hania, director of *Beauty and the Dogs*, (Un Certain Regard, Official Selection - Festival de Cannes) and filmmakers Jihan El-Tahri and May Odeh. Dox Box Director Diana El Jeiroudi will add her voice to take the stock of non-fiction filmmaking in the Arab world today.

Quote of Pierre-Alexis Chevit, Manager of the Doc Corner at the Marché du Film – Festival de Cannes: "We are often feeling powerless witnesses of the situation in the Middle East and Africa. Filmmakers are empowering films with a chance to have an impact and propose solutions. We felt it was important at the Doc Day to bring voices from audacious women from the Arab World who have the courage to give their insider's overview with some achieved successes and battles still to come."

To close this afternoon session, veteran Filmmaker **Barbet Schroeder** will honour the Doc Day with his presence for a conversation with **Ally Derks** about *The Venerable W.*, the last instalment in the director's Trilogy of Evil, selected for a Special Screening in Official Selection at the Festival de Cannes.

• The **Doc Lovers Mixer** will bring everyone together to pursue sharing ideas and passions over drinks, bringing the Doc Day to a friendly conclusion out by the sea.
